- 1. Apply for admission to Shoreline Community College. Indicate your interest in receiving conditional guaranteed admission to the University of Oregon on your Shoreline application.
- 2. Receive an admission letter from Shoreline Community College, as well as a conditional guaranteed admission letter to the University of Oregon AT THE SAME TIME!
- 3. Take your admission letters, along with your I-20 document, to the U.S. embassy or consulate and apply for your F-1 visa.
- 4. Enroll at Shoreline and finish the first half of your Bachelor's degree by earning an A.A. or A.S. degree.
- 5. Transfer to the University of Oregon to finish the second half of your Bachelor's degree.
- 6. Complete your Bachelor's degree from the University of Oregon!

Conditional Guaranteed Transfer Admission to the University of Oregon Requires:

- Earned a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50;
- Successfully completed (C- /1.5 or better) English 101 and English 102. The requirement to submit an English Proficiency test result for general admission to UO's undergraduate program will be waived for international students who successfully meet this standard.
- Successfully completed at least 36 transferable quarter credits;
- Submitted all official college/university transcripts, and provide certified English translation if needed;
- The student must meet the application deadline for the term they wish to begin studying at UO.
- This agreement is for general undergraduate admission to UO. Some specific majors have additional requirements including but not limited to Business, Architecture, Product Design, Art, Music, International Studies and Digital Arts.
